It is the judgment that a particular expression of wisdom continues to offer enduring value and has earned its place within this collection. A person's failures do not necessarily diminish every truth they discovered. Likewise, a truthful observation does not excuse a lifetime of wrongdoing. Faithful stewardship requires us to hold both realities together.

This responsibility requires discernment. Not every memorable statement is wisdom. Not every influential figure is a Legend. Not every quotation earns its place within this collection. The same responsibility belongs to every Seeker: to read with curiosity and discernment, allowing wisdom to challenge, encourage, comfort, or simply remind them of something they had forgotten.

Chapter II

On Verification

Faithful attribution, as we have said, is part of faithful preservation; we cannot preserve what we cannot first verify.

When new evidence emerges — a stronger source, a documented correction, a scholarly consensus that shifts — our judgment moves with it. Verification is not a single decision made once at the door. It is an ongoing responsibility, exercised each time the historical record changes.

On Translation

A translation is not a neutral act. To render a thought from one language into another is to interpret it — to choose, among several possible renderings, the one judged closest to the original's meaning. Quote Legends does not claim to escape this. We do not produce definitive translations. We faithfully preserve the translation that, in our judgment, most clearly and accurately conveys the enduring wisdom of the original.

This judgment is not made lightly. Where a work has been rendered many times across many years, we give weight to translations produced by accredited and verified scholars and historians — those who have studied not only the language, but the era, the idiom, and the mind of the person being translated. A translation earns its place in this collection the same way a quotation does: not by popularity alone, but by its fidelity to what was written, and the wisdom it faithfully conveys.

We recognize that no translation is perfect, and that reasonable scholars can render the same words differently. When this occurs, we preserve the version that, in our judgment, most faithfully conveys the enduring wisdom of the original, even when a more literal rendering exists. Literal accuracy alone is not always faithful preservation, just as elegance alone is not faithful translation.

Faithful preservation, in translation, asks something further of us: transparency. Every translated quotation is an act of interpretation standing between the Seeker and the original words, and we do not pretend otherwise. Wherever possible, we make that interpretation visible rather than invisible — so the Seeker knows a translator's judgment stands between them and the original words.

Between the original and the reader stands a translator's judgment, and behind that, our own. A Legend's wisdom deserves to arrive as close to intact as language allows.

On Revision

An institution that preserves truth must also remain willing to correct itself. Quote Legends does not treat a quotation's inclusion as a final judgment, closed once made. What we present today reflects our best understanding today — and our best understanding is not exempt from being wrong.

Error arrives in different forms. A translation may be superseded by one more faithful to the original. We do not treat correction as failure. An institution that never revises anything has either achieved perfect knowledge, or stopped checking its work. Quote Legends claims neither. Each correction is evidence that verification, translation, and attribution are being taken seriously — not once, at the moment a quotation enters the collection, but continuously, for as long as it remains.
